Out of the 5 Teens in the car Tyler was the only one to sustain an injury (Blunt Force Trauma) he Lay 3 blocks from home in the middle of a very busy road as group of concerned witnesses surrounded his body until the paramedics arrived. Was he wearing his seat belt? There was no way to tell the right rear passenger side was destroyed. This MVP Football Player, physically fit and the picture of health...He had taken such Good
